IN MEMORY OF BOB ZEIT**

Bob was not only one of the first members of our Society, he was also one of the most diligent promoters of Ben Hunt, having worked side by side with Ben on many projects that were featured in *Boys' Life* magazine, the main publication of the Boy Scouts of America. Bob's father was a friend of Ben's and accompanied Ben at Boy Scout Jamborees and Hoe Downs throughout Wisconsin.

Bob was our Society's chief docent at the cabin, providing countless tours for Boy Scouts, school children, whittling groups, and Native Americans. In addition, from the late 1980s to shortly before his death in 2016, Bob spent at least two hours every week cataloging the items that make up our collection of Ben Hunt artifacts. He was an invaluable source of information, and our book on Ben Hunt features Bob's tour of the cabin in his own words.

For all these reasons and more, our Society will honor Bob by planting a Serviceberry tree in front of the Ben Hunt Cabin. We are currently working out the details with the Village DPW. Stay tuned for our announcement of date and time.
